Supplementary Regulations

The Event

A Rallycross is an event generally held on an unpaved, flat surface, wherein the course generally consists of straight sections and connecting turns and corners. Accent in course design is also placed on the general avoidance of obstacles such as trees, exposures, deep ditches, etc. Please see "Eligibility of Vehicles" and other preparation information below. This Rallycross Event will take place inside the Hope Sports Bowl in the city centre of Hope B.C. Surface Terrain will be hard packed dirt and gravel or mud depending on weather conditions.

Jurisdiction

The rally will be held under the current Rallycross regulations of the Canadian Association of Rallysport (CARS). This publication is available from CARS.

Status

Sanctioned by the Canadian Association of Rallysport (CARS) and Rally Pacific Motorsports (RPM).

Registration

Online entry for event will be made available on WCRA Website: www.rallybc.com

Entries will be accepted until close of registration. Bring a copy of filled out entry form as well as entry fee to Registration. Exact change or cheque is preferred.

All cheques should be made out to West Coast Rally Association.

Event entries are limited; this is on a first-come first-serve basis. Once the event has been filled a wait-list will be started. If you have registered and are unable to attend please notify the Registrar at least 24 hours before the event.

Registration closes on Friday, July 11th, 2014 at 6pm.

The maximum number of entries will be limited to **20 drivers**. The organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry. Dual driver vehicles are allowed. Any vehicle(s) with more than two drivers will require the permission of the event Rallymaster.

Competitors need to have a CARS Basic competition license, available at registration, or valid Regional/National Rally license. Residents of the US may compete on a Rally America or NASA Rally license. A one-day Basic License is available for \$10. Competitors who are not a member of an RPM affiliated club (WCRA, IRC, STSRC) will need to either purchase an annual membership or a one-day membership for \$10

Refunds

As per CARS GCR 4.9, any refund will be mailed to the competitor following the rally.

Venue

Headquarters, registration, scrutineering and the event will all take place inside the Hope Sports Bowl. Staging of vehicles will be in the upper gravel parking lot accessible from 7th Avenue.

Documentation

The following must be shown at registration and must be valid on the day of the event:

- 1. Provincial, or equivalent, driver's license for any crew member listed as driver
- 2. Vehicle registration.
- 3. Third party liability insurance covering the entered vehicle.

4. When the owner of the vehicle is not entered as a driver or passenger, written authorization from the owner of the vehicle will be required.

5. Written permission from a parent or guardian for participation in the rally for persons under the age of 19 on the official form. Download in advance if parent(s) will not be present at the event.

6. A minimum of a CARS Basic rally license for the driver in the Rallycross. Residents of the USA who do not hold a CARS license may compete with a Rally America or NASA Rally license or better. See "Entry Fees" for more information about required memberships.

All competitors, volunteers and spectators (in lower bowl) must sign the event waiver.

ELIGIBILITY OF VEHICLES

Vehicles

a) Vehicles must be based on a production, closed body and chassis to compete. (no convertibles, dune buggies or quads)

b) All loose items in the vehicle must be removed during the event (including from the trunk).

c) Snap-on hubcaps, detachable fender skirts and trim rings must be removed.

d) Tires must be in good condition, with no cord or belts showing or cracks in the tread or sidewalls.

e) Mechanical condition and safety of the vehicle is the responsibility of the competitor.

f) Commercially available RENTAL CARS ARE NOT PERMITTED AT THIS EVENT. If you are driving a car that is not owned by you, you must submit a signed letter of permission from the registered owner, saying that they know that the car will be used in a Rallycross competition and grant you permission to use their vehicle. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED IF THE REGISTERED OWNER OF THE VEHICLE IS NOT PRESENT AT THE EVENT.

Mandatory Equipment

a) Helmets conforming to NRR 1.A.6 or meeting Snell Memorial Foundation standards 2000M or

2000SA (or more recent) must be worn by all drivers and passengers.

DOT helmets will not be accepted

b) Minimum three point seat harnesses must be worn by drivers and passengers.

Vehicle Classes

Safety equipment is unlimited in all classes.

Mud flaps on the drive wheels are encouraged for dirt or gravel courses.

In addition to the regular tech inspection, Scrutineers may ask to re-inspect a competitor's car during or after the event. Refusal of the inspection may result in classification change for the

rest of the event.

The organizers reserve the right to classify or re-classify any vehicle in the interest of fairness to all competitors.

Novice Class

The Novice Class is defined as having competed in less than 3 rallycross events in the previous 3 years. If in a single event you win Novice Class *and* 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Overall, you will not be eligible for Novice Class in the future. Novice Class is independent of the vehicle classes. Novice Class is independent of the WCRA Rallycross Championship.

Timing and Scoring

Cars will run one at a time, timed by stopwatch. Cumulative time will be given as the total of all the driver's runs minus their slowest run from the morning and afternoon session. Places will be given by lowest total time for the day. If the driver was not able to complete all runs, they will be assigned the default time (longest run time of the day plus 15 seconds) for their missed runs.

Penalties for cones and gates will be added to the total time of the run for each individual run.

Cones	2 seconds will be added to the total time for each cone knocked over in an individual run; this does not apply to cones being used as pointers.
Gates	10 seconds will be added to the total time for each gate missed over an individual run.

Vehicles will be split into run groups consisting of 2WD and 4WD classes. The 2WD group will run the course first followed by 4WD vehicles. The groups will alternate for each subsequent heat.

Due to the need of balancing the run groups the Rallymaster may move some vehicles from their respective groups. These vehicles will not be provided with any preferential scoring or penalization for being placed in another group.

Fuel Stops / Service

Please fill up on fuel before coming to the sports bowl. There are no fuel amenities at the venue. There will be space marked out for parking at the venue.

Directions

Hope Sports Bowl From Vancouver:

- Take exit 170 From Kelowna / Merritt Take exit 171
- Right on Flood Hope Road
- Right onto Old Hope Princeton Way toward Nelson Ave
- Left onto 6th Ave, just past Chevron
- Right onto Hudson's Bay St
- Entrance is at the end of Hudson's Bay St on the right
